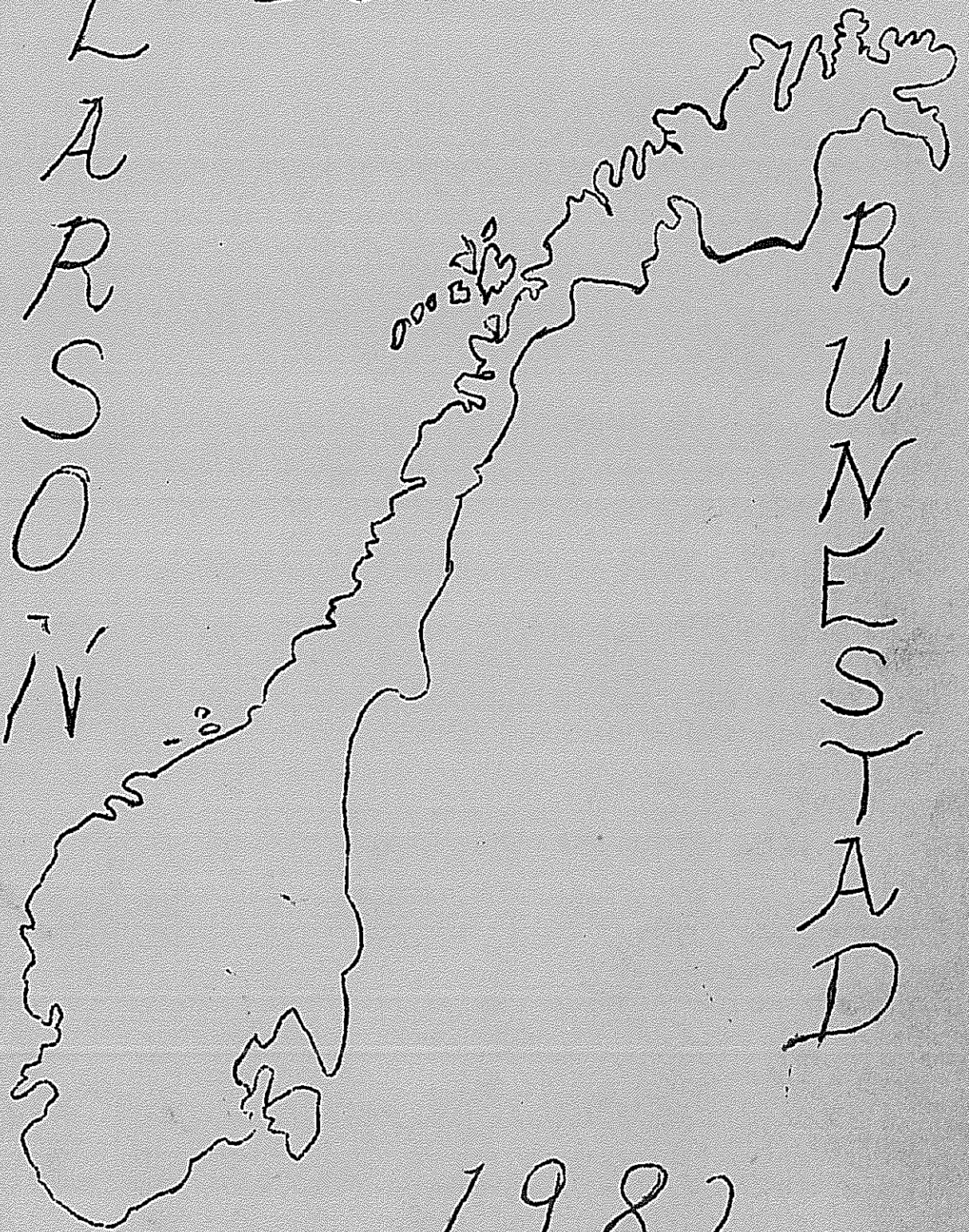


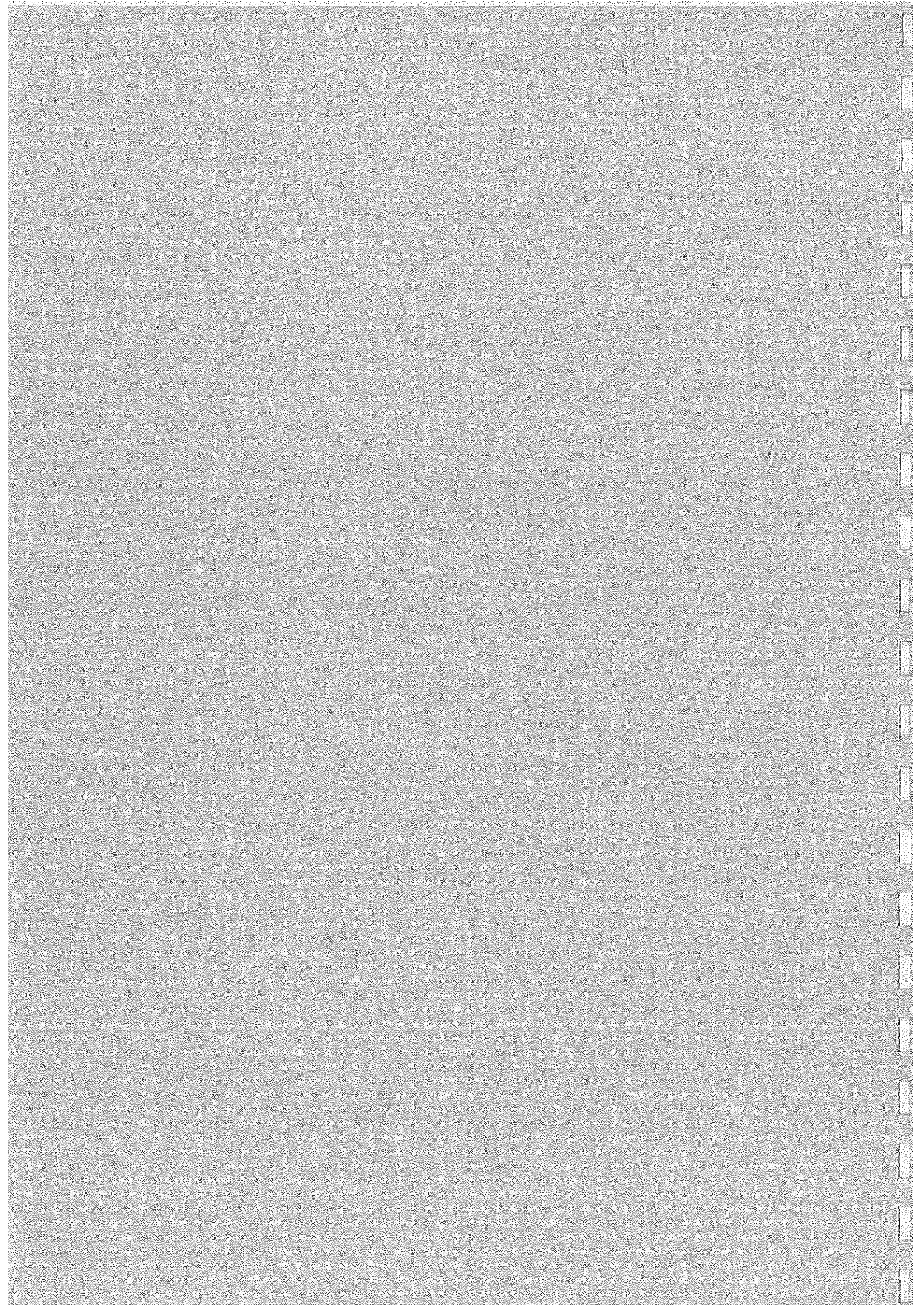

in South Dakota.

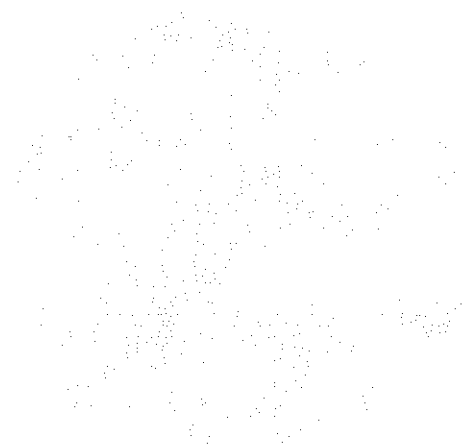


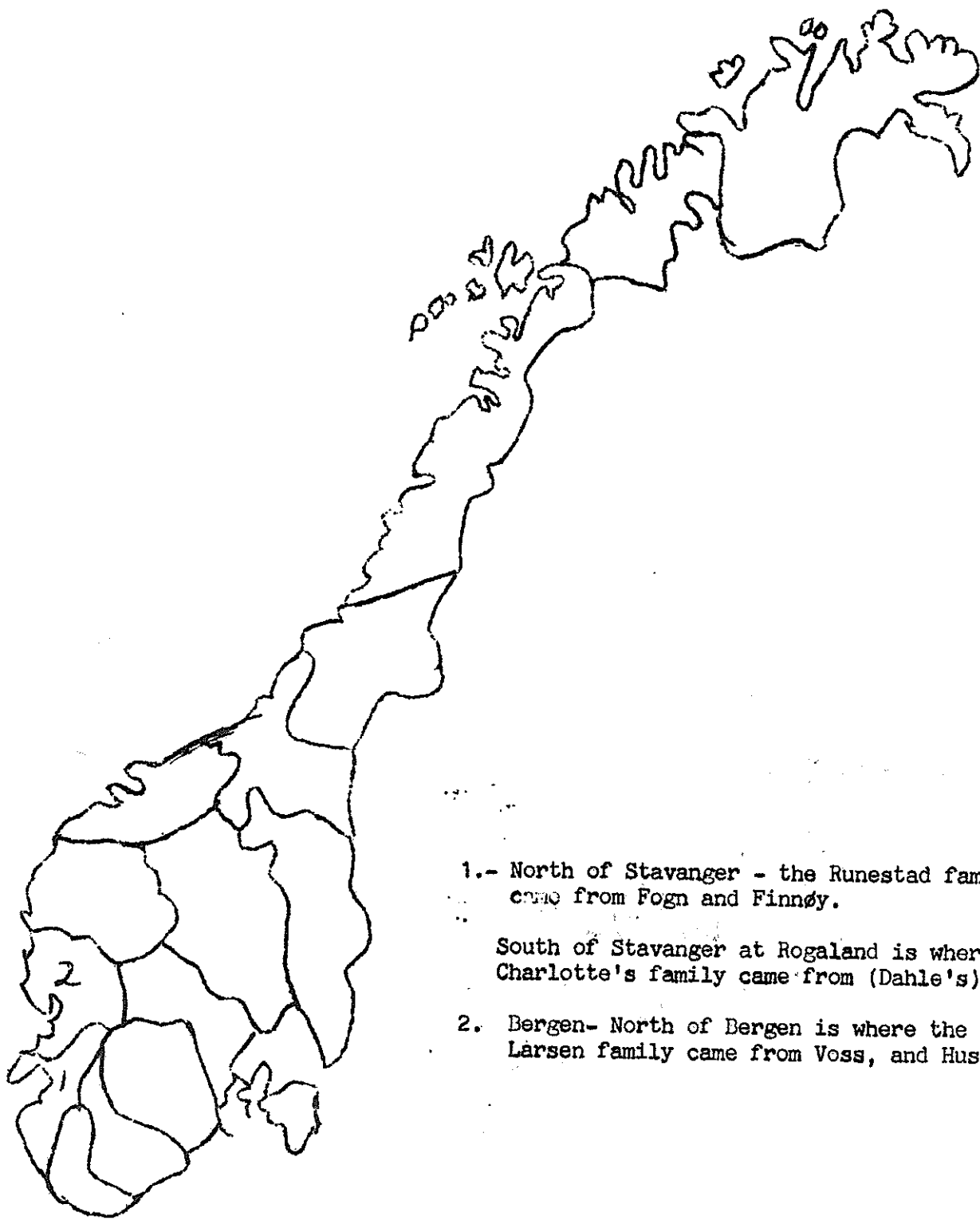

LARS LARSEN LANGAATEN HISTORY

Lars Larson Langaaten was born November 3, and baptized November 8, 1849 in the Kvinnherad parish (parish register of Kvinnherad A 7, page 82b). He was the fifth child born to Lars Larsen a farmer and Anna Larsdatter.

Lars Larsen Langaaten was a widower and 51 years old when he married Anna Larsdtr, who was 26 years old on May 13, 1838 they were married. Lars Larsen's father was Lars Amundsen and Lars Nielsen.

Lars and Anna had the following children:

1. Lars Larsen, born December 19, baptized December 27, 1839. He married Elen Sophie Larsen (born September 5, 1838) from Augvaldsnes, and went to Fjaler to take over the Landgrocery Strømsnes.
2. Hans Larsen, born March 9, baptized May 16, 1842.
3. Gisloga Larsdtr born May 5, baptized May 16, 1844. She married Ole Pettersen born 1834. They lived in Holmedals in Skanevik.
4. Guro Larsdtr, born June 17, baptized August 25, 1846.
5. Lars Larsen, born November 3, baptized December 2, 1849. He married Anna Gurina Runestad Selvog who was born December 4, 1860. She first married John Selvaag first (1851-1886).
6. Knud Larsen, born January 30, baptized February 8, 1852.

Lars Larsen Langaaten died May 22, 1852 at the age of 66 years old. His widow Anna Larsdtr married again on August 6, 1855, to Fartein Nielson Rødsten who was 28 years old.

We loose Lars Larsen from when he was baptized until he homesteaded in America. Lars Larsen first arrived in Livingston County, Illinois and worked there by the month before coming to the Dakota Territory and homesteading on N2 NW4 and SW4 NW4 and NW4 SW4 of Section 34 Township 195 Range 62. Filed under homestead entry No. 17585 at Mitchell, Dakota Territory on the 30th day of January in the year 1882.

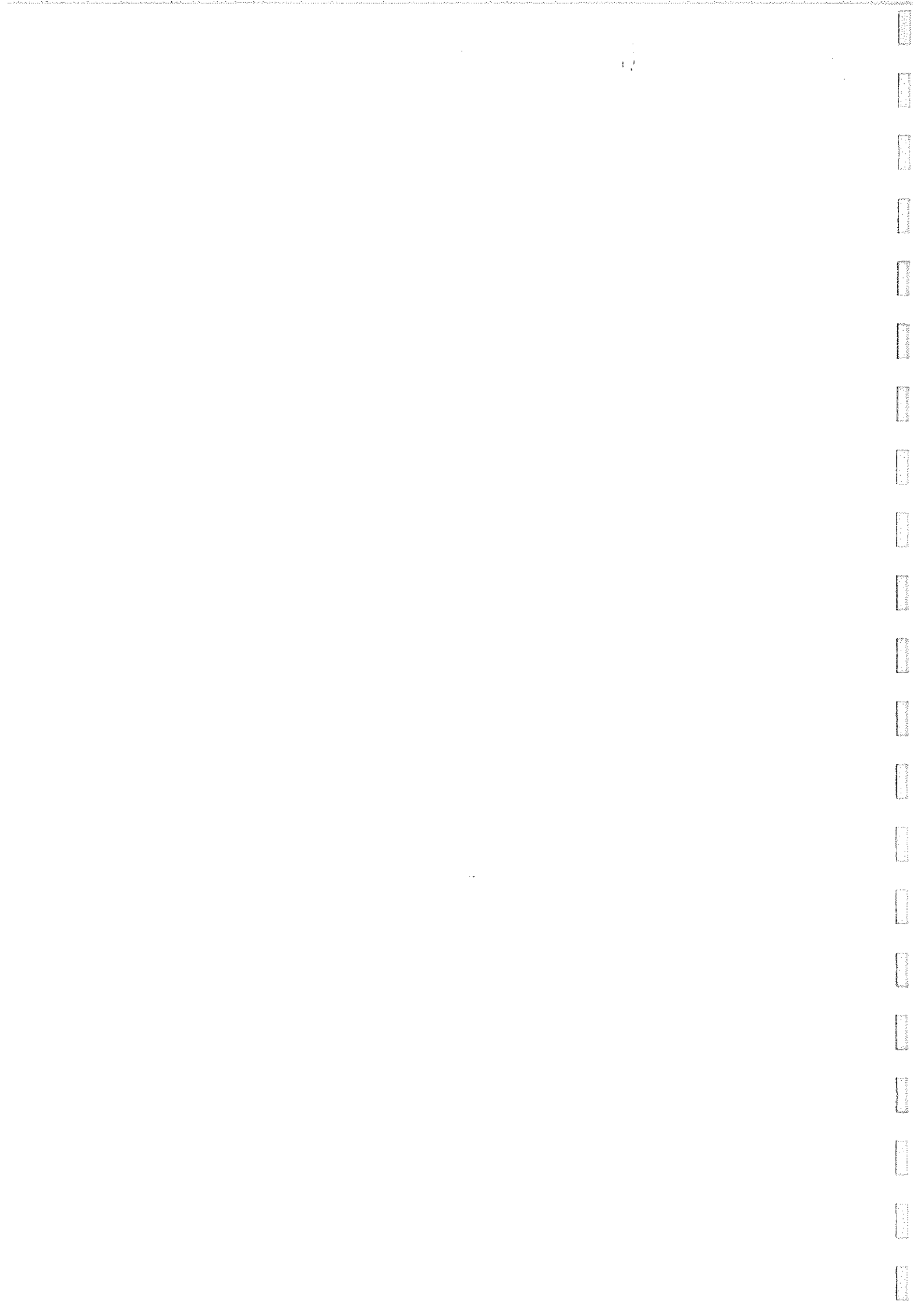
On October 26, 1886 in Davison County before the Honorable Bartlett Tripp Presiding Judge, Lars Larson became a citizen of the United States.

Lars also had a timber claim in Section 15 Township 107 Range 68.

In February of 1882, Lars Larsen with the help of Lars Gismervig built a house. The house measured 14 x 16 x 8. It was sodded on the outside and boarded and papered inside. It also had a shingled roof and was perfectly comfortable at all seasons of the year. The house was valued at \$100. Other items on the place were stable 8 x 12 valued at \$100. A well at \$10. Seventy acres of land was broken up at \$4 an acre valued at \$280. Lars had planted about 200 trees and these improvements were made by Lars himself.

Lars moved in the house when they had finished building it before March 15, 1882. The first two years, Lars spent most of his time on his farm working. He also worked for his neighbors staying about half of the nights in his own home and about half where he worked. He also carried on the work on his own farm when he worked out.

Lars worked one month in Sanborn, Iowa and 3 months in the fall of 1884, he went as a hand with a threshing machine in the neighborhood. Lars came home every week or two then.



The three brothers (Lars, Knute, and Hans) own together a binder 2 years, a breaking plow, a stirring plow and harrow one year. Lars also had a wagon.

Lars owned 2 mules, 3 cows, and 3 calves.

The house articles were stove, bed, table, and dishes, chairs and other necessary things.

The crops Lars raised the first 5 years was as follows:

First year - 5 acres sod corn

Second year - 5 acres wheat 10 acres sod flax

Third year - 25 acres flax and corn

Fourth year - 40 acres wheat, oats, flax and corn

Fifth year - 70 acres wheat, oats, flax and corn

This information was given by Lars Larsen on his homestead papers recorded on April 4, 1887. At this time Lars was 36 years old and single.

Lars Larsen had two witnesses when he homesteaded who were Lars Gismervig age 43 on April 4, 1887. Lars Gismervig resided at NW4 Section 3 Township 104 Range 62.

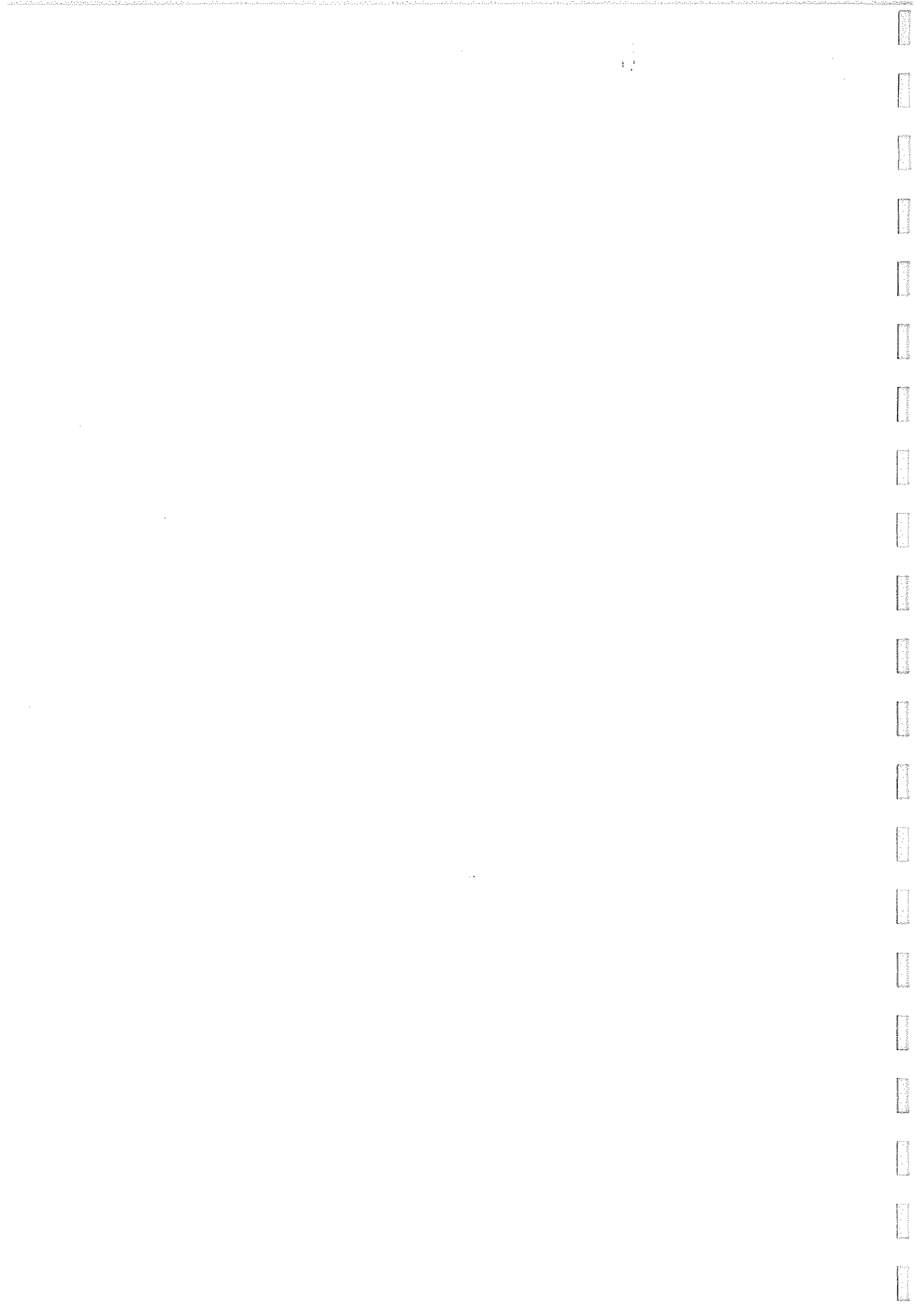
Lars Larsen and Lars Gismervig had known each other for seven years. They lived 100 rods from each other.

Lars Gismervig and Lars Larsen exchanged work with each other. Lars Gismervig helped him thresh his grain.

Knut Nelson was another witness when Lars homesteaded who was 36 years on April 4, 1887 and resided NE4 Section 27 Township 105 Range 62 was also a witness. Knut lived one mile from Lars.

Knut helped Lars thresh, and broke ten acres for him and had been on the land as often as once a month.

Lars Larson also helped build the railroad west of Mount Vernon, South Dakota.



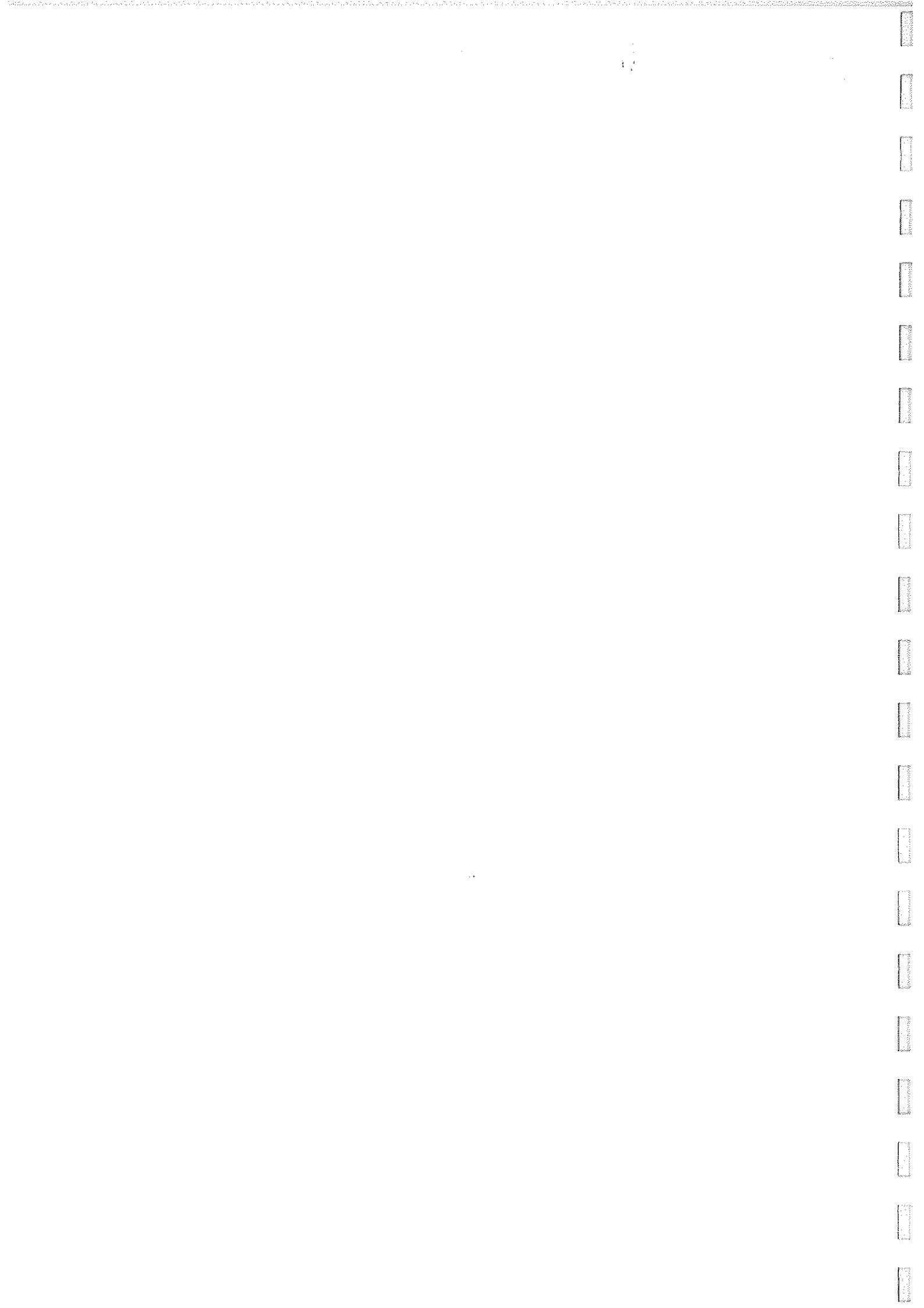

Lars Larsen and Malene Andersdaughter married in Finnøy Parish on July 13, 1855. Lars was born in Hjelmeland parish. His father's name was Lars Larsen Lillebø. Lars was 28 when he married in 1855. Lars was born in 1827 and died in 1879.

Malene was 24½ years when she married and her father's name was Anders Omundson Selvaag. Selvaag and Runestad are neighboring farms. Malena 1830 to 1914.

Children born to Lars and Malene Are:

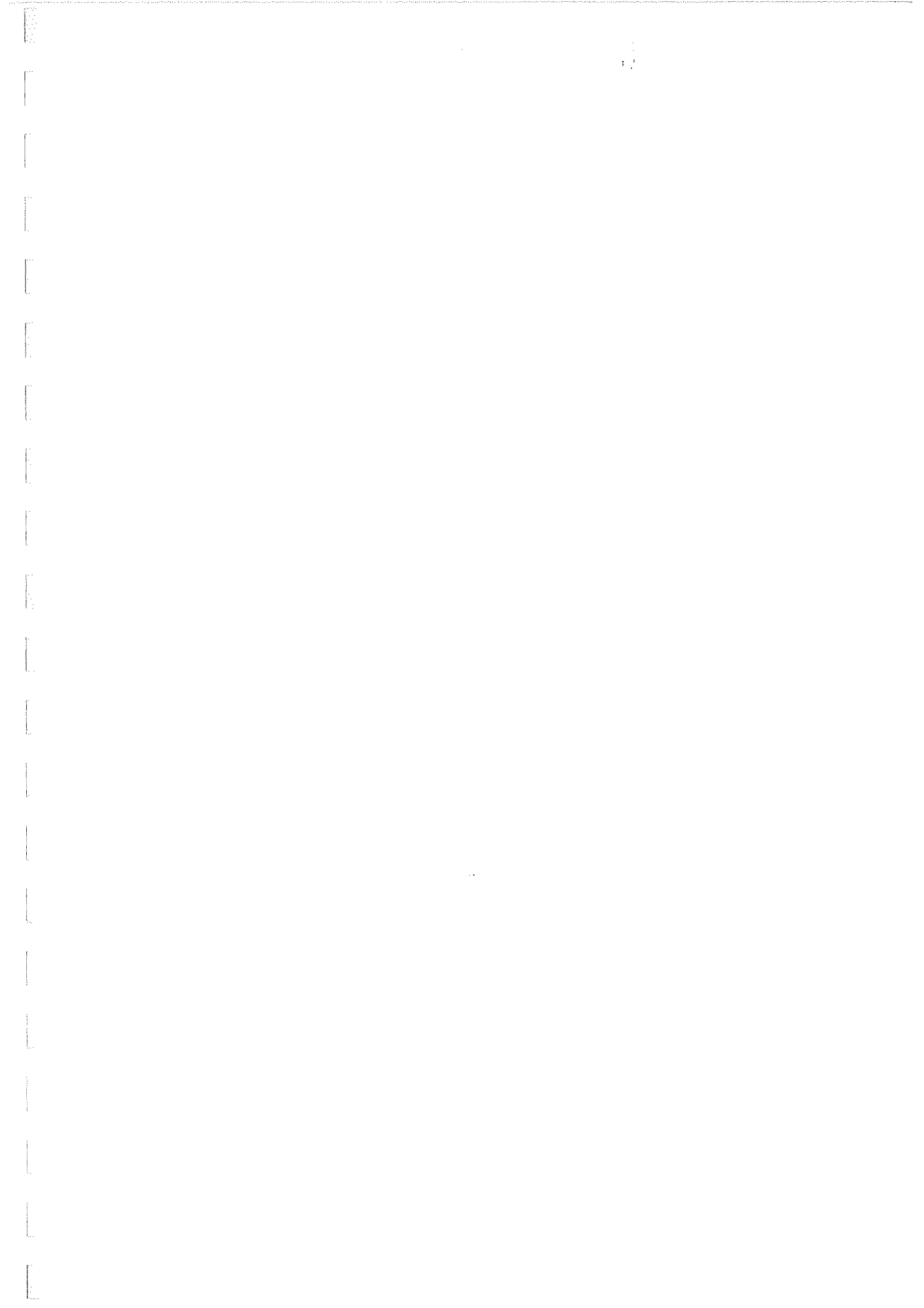
1. Anders: died when he was a baby
2. Kristine was born January 12, 1857. She married Karl Johan Dahle ~~from~~ from Dahle, Norway. Johan was born September 9, 1854 and died September 7, 1946. Kristine died on December 1, 1945.
3. Anna Gurina was born December 1, 1860 and died March 24, 1941. Anna married John Selvaag who was born in 1851 and died February 10, 1886 after living in America only a few months (9 or 11 months). Anna Gurina later married Lars Larson who was born November 3, 1849 in Norway and died July 10, 1926.
4. Martha was born near Stavanger, Norway on December 2, 1862 and passed away at her home near Mt. Vernon on September 3, 1935 at the age of 72 years 9 months and 1 day after several years of illness (ruptured went in). She with her sister, Elizabeth Berg came to America in May 1887 and was united in marriage to Ole G. Larson on July 22, 1890. Ole G. Larson died in 1914.
5. Bertha Johanna twin to Martha born December 2, 1862 and died in 1917 from TB.
6. Elisabet was born in June 3, 1864 and married Albert Berg born December 9, 1864 in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Albert and Elisabet were married November 1, 1889. Albert died January 21, 1929 and Elisabet died June 4, 1936.
7. Malena was born 1867.
8. Andreas Larssen Runestad was born in July 2, 1870 and died on July 28, 1904. He married Aagine Helmine Johnsd (Opsal) on August 13, 1889. Aagine was born October 3, 1872 and died May 7, 1941.
9. Pauline Larsd (Lena) was born in 1873 and died in 1958 in Norway. Aunt Lena lived in America until after Aunt Martha died then she went back to Norway.

John Levi Larson was born in Elliott Township Sanborn County, South Dakota on his Father's homestead on October 11, 1895. He attended Christoper School and was confirmed at East Trinity Lutheran Church.

Charlotte Dahle was born March 2, 1903 at Nedre Øksnevad, Klepp, Norway. She attend school at Øvre Øksnevad and was confirmed in Klepp Church on September 30, 1917. She worked at home and several other places until she came to America on March 2, 1930.

Levi worked on several farms before he was drafted into the service in 1918 but the war was over before he was taken overseas. He served in the 49th. Balloon Company. After returning from the army he was Farm Manager of the Beloit Orphanage for about two years. For several years he farmed in Highmore, South Dakota.

Levi married Charlotte Dahle on July 31, 1933 in Park Rapids, Minnesota with Fred and Minnie and Roselyn Nelson as witnesses. They farmed in several places around the area before moving to Logan Township, Sanborn County, South Dakota in 1938.

Two children were born a son, Glenn on August 6, 1934 and a daughter Janet on March 7, 1937.

Glenn and Janet attended Letcher, Grade School and Augustana Academy High School at Canton, South Dakota.

Glenn took his Airforce Service training in Lakeland, Texas and he worked at the airforce bases in Charleston, South Carolina, and Goosebay, Canada. Afterwards he farmed with his father until Levi's death on May 1, 1971.

Janet attended Augustana and Madison Colleges and worked as a school teacher in Hoonah, Alaska for one year before getting married to Denton Thompson on October 4, 1959. Denton was born February 10, 1931.

We are living on Grandma (Anna) Larson's homestead in Elliott Township, Sanborn County, South Dakota.

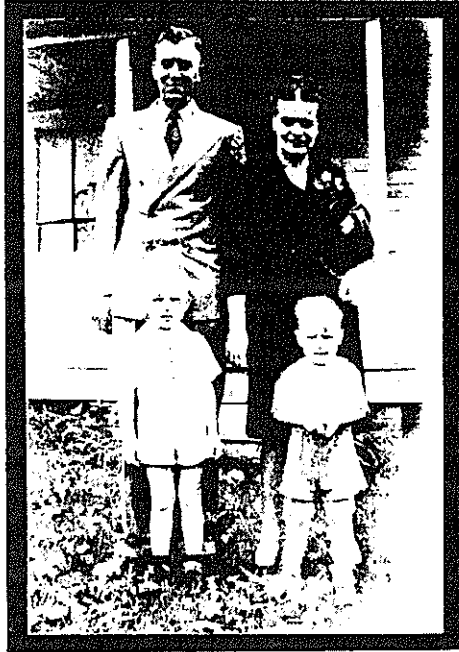

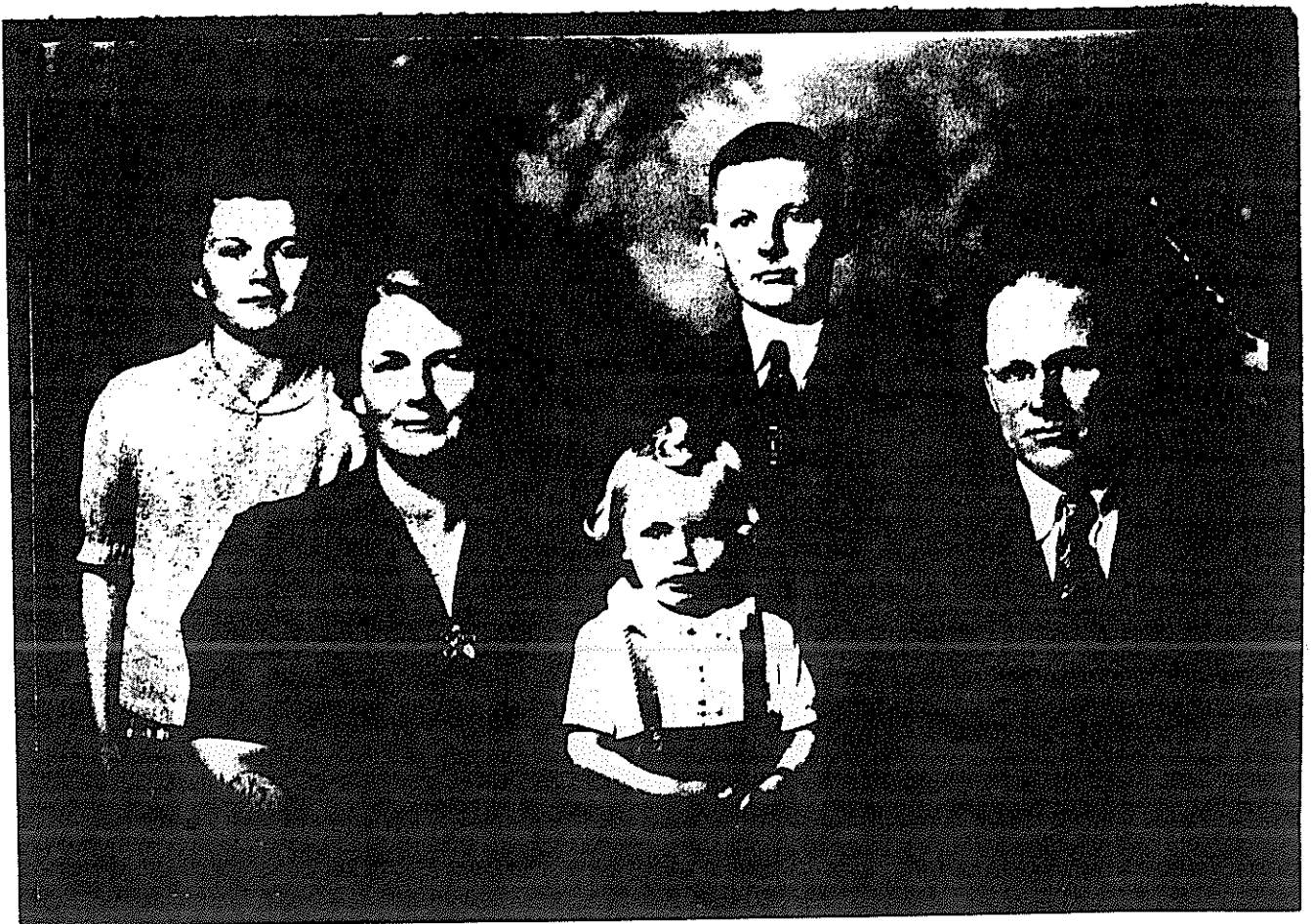
Milo was confirmed on December 14, 1913 in Sanborn County, South Dakota by Pastor Adolph Egge.
